13 The Oregon Veterinary Medical Examining Board (OVMEB) is the state agency responsible  
14 for regulating, licensing, and disciplining veterinarians in the State of Oregon. During all times  
15 relevant to this proceeding, Daniel Koller was licensed as a veterinarian with the Board.

## **Findings of Fact & Conclusions of Law**

18                   October 24, 2024, the Board filed a Proposed Notice of Discipline and mailed it certified  
19 and regular mail to Licensee. That notice provided that the Board file would be used as the record  
20 for purposes of default. That notice also notified Licensee that they needed to ask for a hearing  
21 within 21 days. The Board did not receive a hearing request during those 21 days. On December 12,  
22 2024, the Board received a check for \$250. On or about, December 31, 2024, when sent a  
23 settlement agreement to consider, Licensee made a late hearing request, stating in sum, that he  
24 thought the Propose Notice of Discipline “was a simple citation as the amount demanded reflected.  
25 I felt no need to waste my time on this matter. That is why I paid the fine.” The Board finds that  
26 this was not good cause for the late hearing request and issues this default final order.

27 The Board now finds the following facts and conclusions of law: On or about April 12,  
28 2024, Licensee performed a spay on cat Hissy, during which you discovered an abscess that you  
29 treated and closed with steel surgical staples. Licensee provided home care instructions for the  
30 spay, but failed to provide any home care instructions for the abscess, which was in violation of

31 OAR 875-011-0010(9), which is grounds for a \$250 civil penalty under ORS 686.120(1) and ORS  
32 686.150(7).

36 The Board hereby assess an \$250 total civil penalty.
